I always give my mother a call every morning.

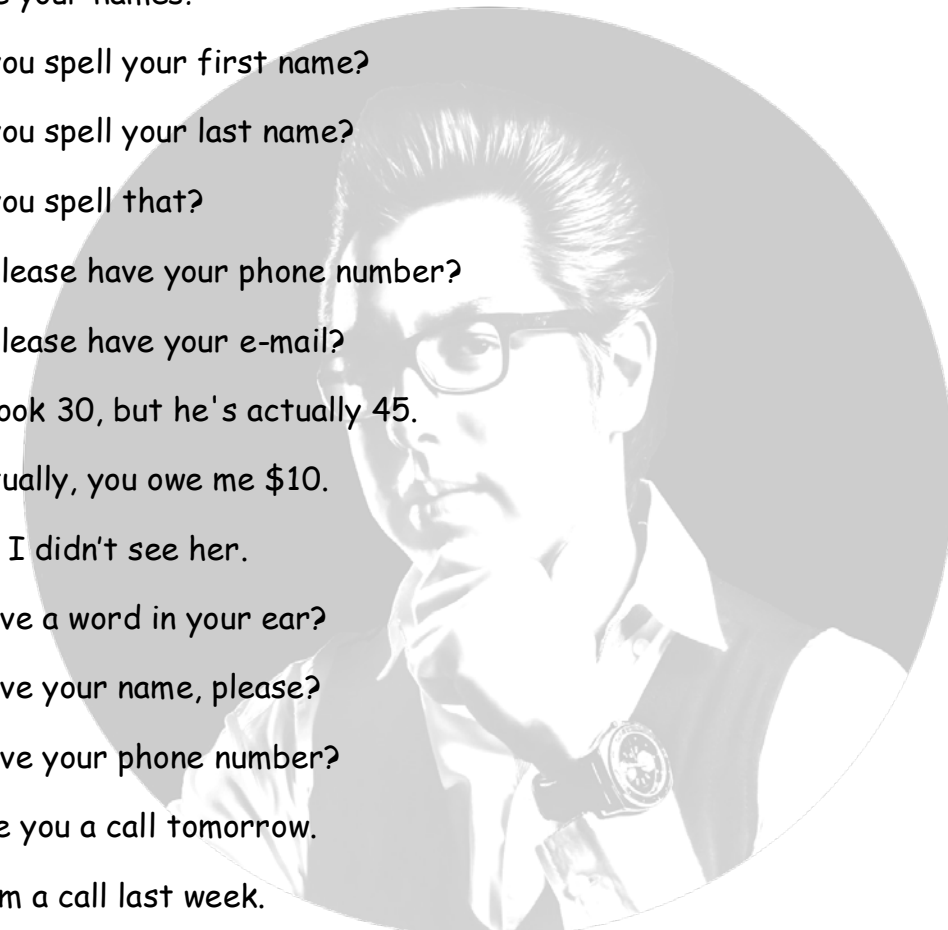
It's a long story. I'll tell you about it sometime.

I didn't know you had a car.

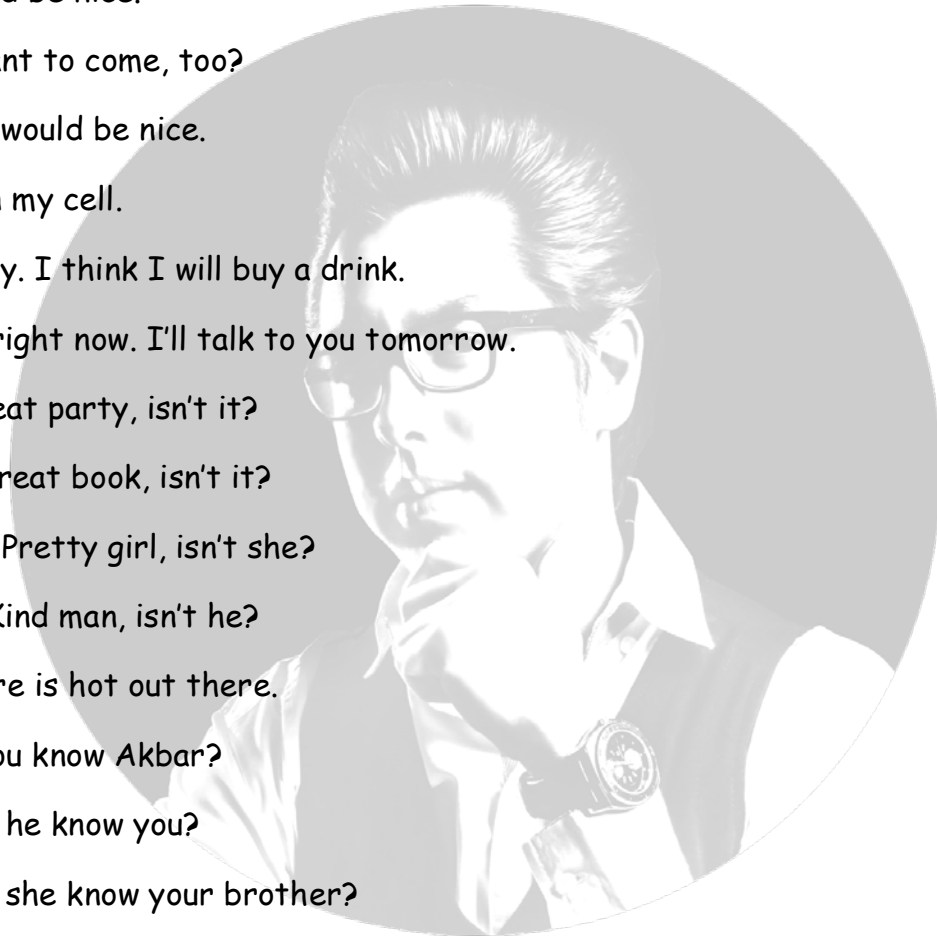
I didn't know he had a child.

Are you well?

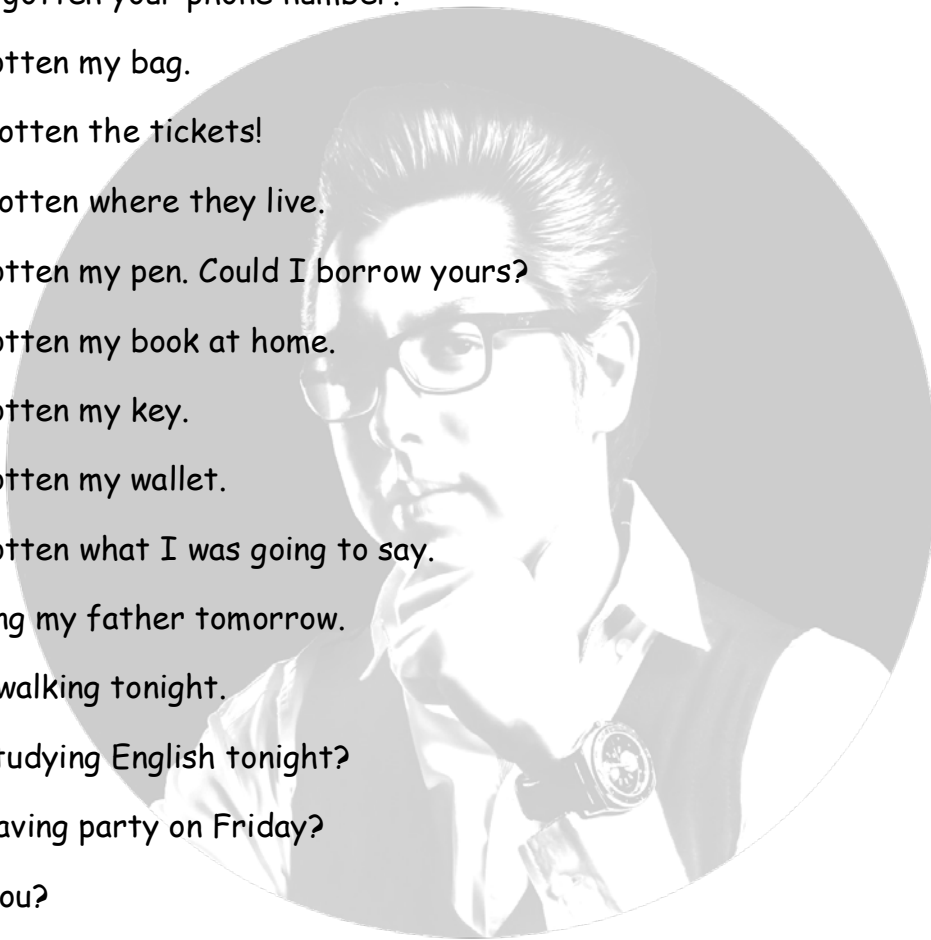
How are things?
